
A winter break will be good and deserved after all we have achieved until the June 17th working bee on the seat in Mahakipawa, and a Mid-Winter Market,


Daffodil Day in August and Diabetes Awareness in Havelock in September.



BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS 3 APRIL 2018

Art Blom will be the guest speaker at our dinner meeting on Tuesday 17th April. Art is a director of Mills Bay Mussels (formerly Hairy Mussels).

We will be making a presentation to Sue Rose of the Marlborough Child Cancer Foundation at the meeting and eight members from Beavertown Lions are visiting us on the night,

We believe we have now raised sufficient funds to pay for the bus shelter, thanks to the funds raised through the Book Sale.

Soon our Club will be able to have Petanque and Bocce balls available for members of the public to use. Bow to Stern have agreed to hold the balls and lend them out on payment of a refundable bond of \$20.

Our Zone is combining to partially sponsor a camp for children with diabetes and their parents which is to be held at Kiwi Ranch 16-18th September. The cost per child is \$60, \$80 per adult. Our Club is contributing \$100 and the Rai Valley Leo Club have committed to sponsor a child.

The Board has decided that we will not proceed with the Labour Weekend Book Sale, instead we will put our resources into the Easter project in April next year.

The Havelock Community Association have invited us to hand the large Lion sign in the Supper Room. We have accepted that offer but will look to getting the sign refurbished first.

Keep Sunday 17th June free as we will have a working bee on that day to refurbish the Addie Barrer seat at Mahakipawa which is badly in need of it after six years' exposure to high tides, rain and salt spray. Addie was our first woman President and the seat was commissioned by her family and put in place by our Club.
