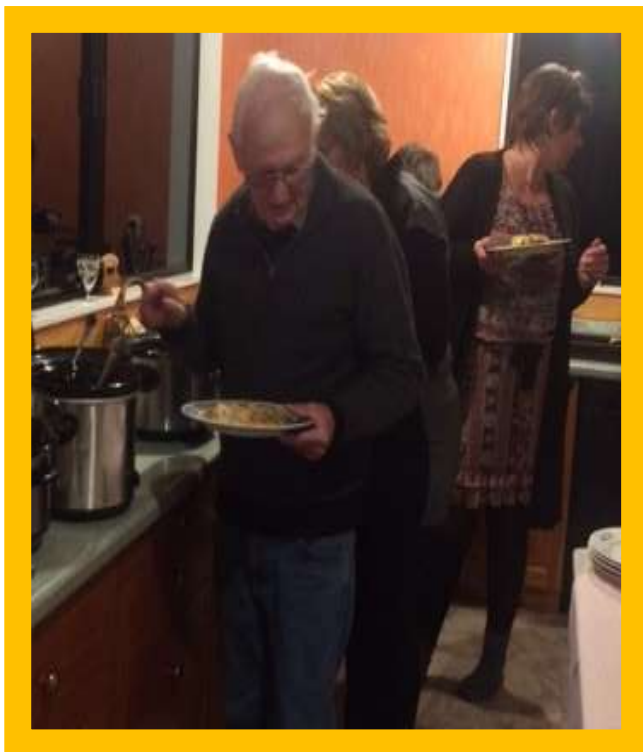
Crockpot Evening

We will be holding a good-old-fashioned Thermette lunch on 30th September- more details at Dinner Meeting.

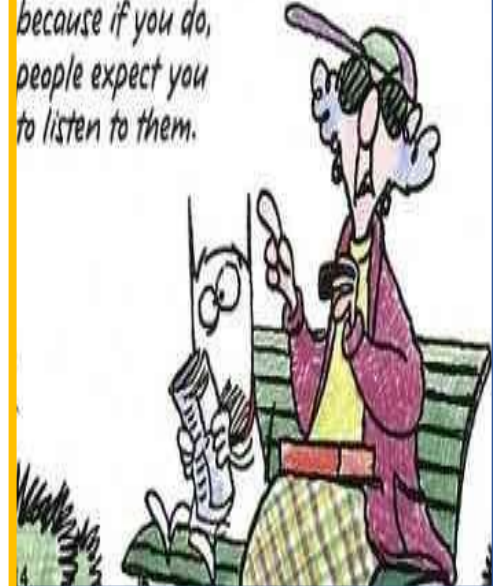

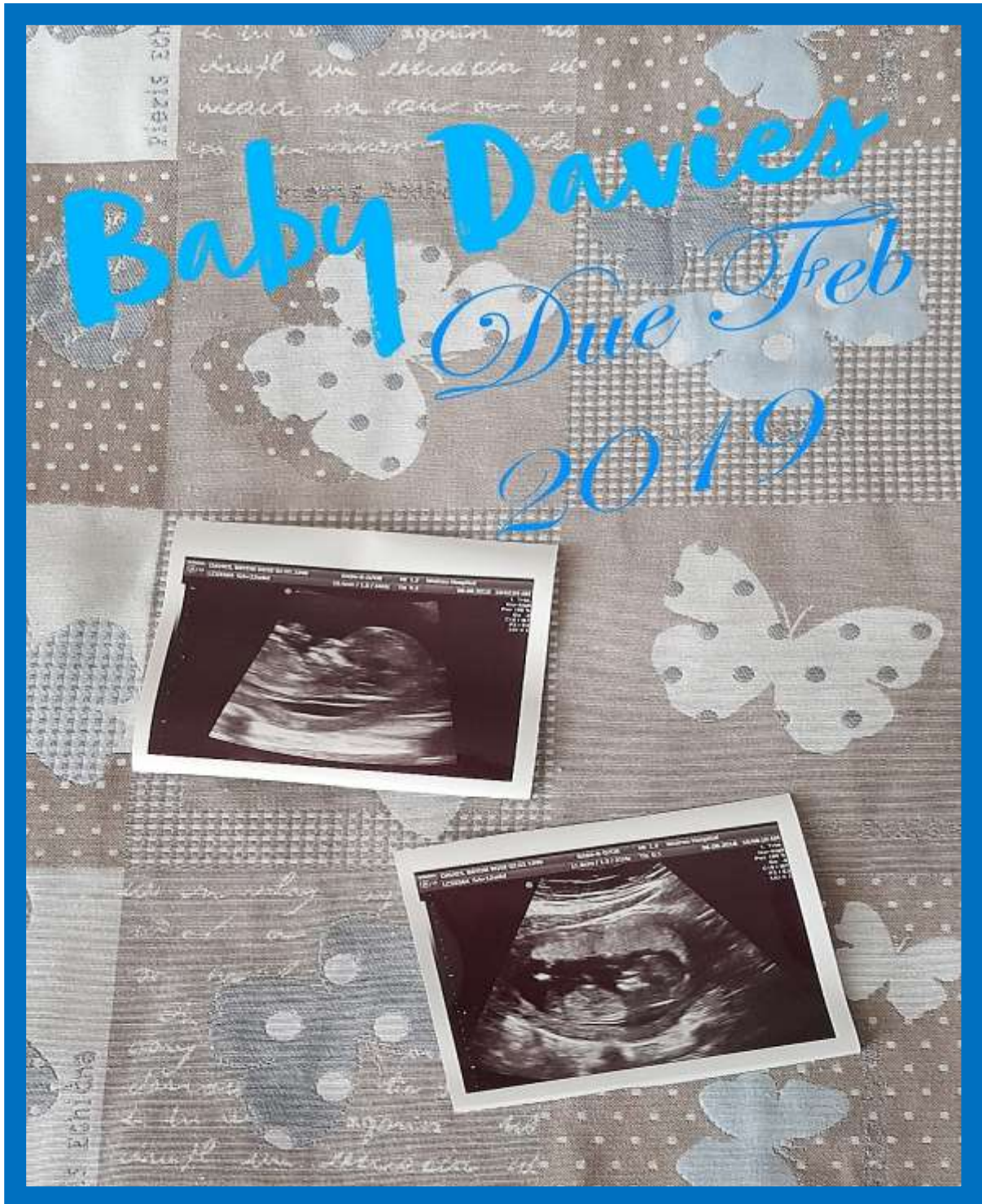
