Our February market which was held on the same day as the Muddy Buddy was a success with positive feedback from stall holders who appreciated the timing.

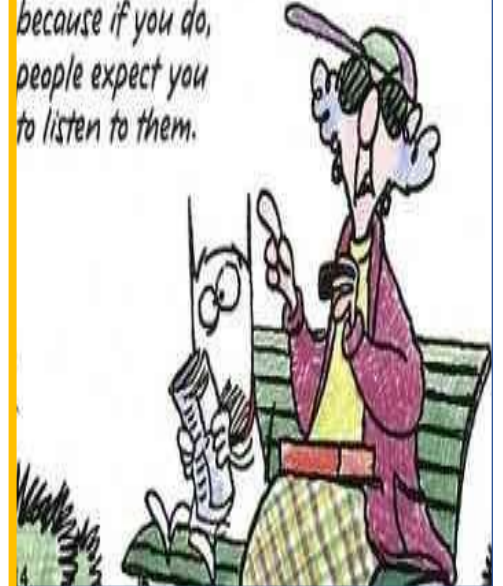

The balance of the fee is being put towards our proposed joint Top of the South diabetes project. You will hear more about this at our dinner meeting.

We are donating \$400 to Birdsong Havelock- Waiata Manu. The organisation has been set up with the aim of ridding Havelock of pests such as rats, stoats etc. The money will enable the Menzshed to build 40 traps which will form the basis of a "library". The traps can be borrowed by any resident with the only obligation to report catches.

We have been invited to run a Market at Kaituna Ridges Ramble on 13th April. We will have a table there and have invited our usual stall holders if they wish to participate.

A reminder that the Multiple District Convention is being held in Blenheim between 26 -28 April. We have been asked to look after the reception desk on the Friday night and Saturday morning. There will be a list circulating at our dinner meeting.

JOINT ZONE PROJECT DIABETES

The Lions Clubs of Zones 2 & 3 (Nelson and Marlborough) have been asked to help raise funds for the provision of essential monitoring equipment for diabetics, especially children. There are 150,000 people living in Nelson and Marlborough and it is estimated 1 person in 4 will suffer from diabetes in one form or another. To assist in raising funds for this project, a Zone project that all clubs can participate in is currently under investigation. Publicity to increase the exposure of Top of the South Diabetes and of the Lions Clubs in Nelson and Marlborough is also being planned. Our Club is supporting this project.
