A reminder that our project to refurbish the Barrer memorial seat at Mahakipawa is planned to take place on 6th November. More details as we know how cooperative the weather will be then.


Our first Market of the season will be held outside the Town Hall on Saturday 27th October. Names of those who are willing to help will be collected at our dinner meeting.

It has been decided that we have some people with very interesting life histories in our Club and that we should endeavour to have one of our own members speak at a dinner meeting once every three months. This month Phil Thomas has agreed to be our speaker.

The Board has decided that we will purchase the Ernest Adams Fruit cakes this year and members will be asked at the Dinner Meeting as to how many cakes are wanted. This will be a good fund raiser for the Club as we pay \$13 for them and the recommended retail price for each cake is \$20.

The Club is again donating \$100 to the Christchurch Cancer Shuttle appeal. This appeal is organised by Motueka Lions Club. The shuttle solely transports patients daily from their accommodation in Daffodil House and Daffodil Lodge to receive their treatment of radiotherapy and chemotherapy at Christchurch Hospital, 15000.00 transfers last year. These patients mainly coming from Kaikoura Marlborough, Nelson, Tasman, Golden Bay, Buller, West Coast, Mid Canterbury and South Canterbury. The work load for the shuttle has not eased and annual costing of \$60.000.00 is very similar from year to year. Our contribution last year virtually covered the annual fuel cost reducing the load considerably.

The Board resolved to again contribute to Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) based on \$10 per member. Our Thermette picnic at the Newton Farm on 30th September was a very pleasant afternoon. The weather was kind to us and we got to see some vintage Thermettes. The Board resolved to accept Muff's kind invitation to make this an annual event.
