CHARITABLE DONATIONS APPROVED BY BOARD

The following payments were approved by the Board at its meeting on 1st October:

To Havelock Community Association: For hire of Pavilion for Seniors Luncheon \$20

To Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF): annual donation for use in areas of greatest need. \$390 (\$15 per member)

To Lloyd Morgan Lions Club Charitable Trust: annual donation. \$390

To District 202E: annual donation towards youth activities in the District: \$100

To Kade Martin: Donation towards Youth Exchange visit to Japan (Kade is the Vice President and co-Secretary of Rai Valley Leo Club. \$200

To Motueka Lions: annual donation towards costs of running Cancer shuttlebus: \$200. This shuttle solely transports patients daily from their accommodation in Daffodil House and Daffodil Lodge to receive their treatment of radiation or chemotherapy at Christchurch Hospital, making in excess of 16,000 transfers annually. Of these 16,000 plus patients approximately 35% are from the Nelson/Marlborough area, 30% from the West Coast Region, 22% from Mid/South Canterbury and the remaining 13% from the regions, Kaikoura, Cheviot, Hanmer, Southland and Otago and on a much smaller scale other parts of the country.

The workload for the shuttle has not eased and annual cost is in excess of \$62,800.00 which is similar from year to year. Last year clubs from 202E and 202J generously donated funds totally \$14,200.00 with donations ranging from \$100 through to \$1,000.00 as individual Clubs could accommodate. The amount of our collective contribution generously contributed to the annual costs for the shuttle, freeing up funds that could be used in other areas such as servicing Daffodil House and Daffodil Lodge.

WOOD CHOP AT CEMETERY

Our Wood chop at the Havelock Cemetery was a great success with nine Lions turning up to cut up the fallen trees which the Council had donated to us. Many thanks to John Butt who volunteered his time, large chain saw and hydraulic splitter and to Dave Sinclair who came back from sea right on time, complete with his chain saw to see us right. Muff and Paul Newton took time off from tailing to give their time and the use of their truck and generously donated a shed to store the wood until it dried and is delivered. Dave Farrant, Deb Healy, Carol and Brian Boswell, Brian and Ian Cameron all lugged logs to the splitter and then to the truck.

The cemetery looks much tidier but there is still another ½ day's work to clean up the rest. President Deb is "in negotiation" with Muff and we hope to know the date for the next session at our dinner meeting. Oh, and thanks for the scones and muffins Deb and Muff!
