### HIGHLIGHTS FROM BOARD MEETING 4th JOLY 2017.

Our newly elected 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor Helen Williams will make her official visit to our Club at our next dinner meeting on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> September. This will be Helen's first visit to any Club in her new role. Coincidently, some members from Beavertown have indicated they will also be visiting us on that night and some of the Blenheim Club also, so we should have a very entertaining night.

The barbecue that our Club is donating to the Havelock Community is here and stored in the Pavilion. When the ground dries out a bit, Dave Farrant with some help will be laying the concrete pad.

The native tree nursery at Muff and Paul's farm is almost set up now and Muff has indicated that it won't be long before we can assist with planting up and pricking out.

There has been a very good response to invitations to be part of Havelock's first Health Expo which we are partnering with Havelock Vision 2020 Charitable Trust. To date there have been 21 acceptances. The dates of the Health Expo, which will be in the Havelock Town Hall are 30<sup>th</sup> September and 2<sup>nd</sup> October. We will be involved in helping with the set up on 29<sup>th</sup> September and taking the partitions down on 2<sup>nd</sup> October. We have been invited to have a sausage sizzle outside the Hall.

Muff has arranged the bagging up of 100 bags of sheep poo which she is donating to our Club, proceeds to our project account.

Our Spring Market will be held outside the Town Hall on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September between 9:00am and 1pm. Market Director Anne asks for Lions to donate baking and any other items for sale at the Market.

The annual Mobility walk, raising funds for Child Mobility is being organised by Beavertown Lions again this year. The date is 8<sup>th</sup> October and it will again be along the Taylor River. You can walk the whole 10km or just as much as you want to.

The Board has decided that we will support Pink Ribbon Day by collecting in Havelock on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October. Further details on times when collectors are needed will be advised.

For the first time in a number of years, the Board has found it necessary to increase our fees. This change has been made necessary through the increase in District fees. The fee for a single member will now be \$65 a year and \$125 for a family. The fee can now be paid by 6 monthly instalments of \$35 and \$30, if that option is preferred.

The Board received a request from Motueka Lions to annually assist towards the running costs of the Christchurch Cancer Society Shuttle, In view of the fact that the total cost of funding the shuttle service is \$64,000 and 35% of total patients provided with accommodation comes from the Nelson/Marlborough area, the Board thought it reasonable to contribute \$100 toward the fund.

As well as these projects clubs can leave a longer lasting mark on their communities by committing to a Club Legacy Project.

Can I also encourage clubs to plan now to attend our Convention in March 2018 - it is the AGM of the district and decisions are made that affect all members. Several officers are elected at this time and it is a great opportunity to catch up with old friends and make new ones.

Great news: I am very pleased to announce that we have appointed Helen Williams as First Vice Governor for 2017-18. This position has been vacant for some time but Helen is both very capable and well qualified – please give her your support.
